RULES FOR THE STUDENTS

STUDENT DISCIPLINE

11. Student who hurts or tries to hurt his/her classmates or teachers or any other staff physically or mentally will be dismissed and action will be taken as per Tamil Nadu Education Act.

12. Punctuality should strictly be kept or attendance will not be given and avoid wandering during class hours.

13. On any cancellation of class, students should silently go to library with the permission of the concern Head of the Department and refer books or journals attentively.

14. At the time of class hours or Interval students should avoid chatting at the threshold or in the premises.

15. It is a tobacco free zone. Using or keeping narcotics or tobacco in the premises is offence and stringent action will be taken.

16. To keep cell phone or any other illegal things in the premises is punishable.

17. Defamation of any religion or language or political party should be avoided.

18. Women sexual harassment is a rigorous crime. The accused, if any, will be punished stringently under the recommendation of The Women Sexual Harassment Prevention Committee members.

19. Money should not be collected among the students without the knowledge of the Principal.
